"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?"

 $oldsymbol{To}$ All In Our Learning Community,

As a Catholic learning community we have been exploring a number of post-resurrection stories. During remote learning families were provided with the opportunity to explore the story of Emmaus presented in the gospel of Luke. This Lucan gospel tells the story of two of Jesus' disciples who were travelling on the road to Emmaus after Jesus' death. They talked of their confusion about the events of Jesus' death and shared their uncertainties and confusions with a fellow traveller who joined them on the road. They are unaware that this 'visitor' to Jerusalem is Jesus. Their eyes are closed. When they invite the traveller to join them for a meal at the end of the day they discover through the breaking of bread that this traveller is in fact the risen Jesus. Upon reflection of their experience their eyes are opened and they think about the conversation on the road and how they recognised it was Jesus, although only realised this when he broke bread with them.

Scripture scholar Brendan Byrne explores this passage from Luke and highlights that the recognition of Jesus occurs in light a bigger picture- a picture that is seen in the context of the wider story told in the scriptures. There is also recognition through the wider community and in the sharing of a meal. It is also through the hospitality offered to the 'visitor' that new insights are gained.

In light of our whole school focus, 'Hospitality and Dialogue' what insights about offering hospitality and engaging with others are we gaining? In what ways might the presence of God be recognised in 'others' whom we engage with?

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

Mother Teresa PS is currently preparing data related to students who receive additional adjustments to assist in their learning.

What is the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data? Schools must now complete the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) every year. It counts the number of students who receive additional adjustments to their learning at school. The NCCD helps governments plan for the needs of students with disability. In order for all members of our learning community to access this information it is provided as an attachment in both English and Arabic.

Indigenous Educational Opportunities

Our learning communities is privileged to have had a long standing partnership with Murrundindi, Wurundjeri elder and cultural educator. Murrundindi will be with us this week to explore story and symbol with a number of our children. His presence and partnership with our learning community enables us to gain greater understanding of Aboriginal peoples. It is particularly significant in light of the recent calls for greater understanding and recognition of Indigenous Australians.

Foundation to Year 2

As **researchers**, we are going further with our wonderings about our compelling question, "Why is it made like that?" We are being resourceful by identifying different ways to make new discoveries. We will engage in experiments, read books, engage in dialogue with experts and watch video clips as a way of finding out.

As **mathematicians**, we are engaging in the mathematical concept of Place Value. Some of us are finding out about different ways to represent numbers using materials such as bundling sticks and MAB Blocks. We are learning to represent and order numbers on a number line. We will make our thinking visible by engaging in focus groups. As a part of Home Learning students have been provided with a focus for their daily counting. We will continue to consolidate this focus at school.

As **thinkers**, we are tuning in to our compelling question, "How can the arts help us to tell stories?" As **researchers**, we will engage in a **shared learning experience** with Murrundindi. With Murrundindi we will interpret different artworks created by an Indigenous Artist, William Barak and engage in four dances that are significant to the Wurundjeri people.

Bridging Centre

Year 3 – 4 Learning Spaces

As **thinkers**, we have begun **reflecting** on ourselves as learners and considering what we would like to focus on, improve or achieve next term. As **self-managers**, we have identified **learning goals** to help us grow as learners, and connected these to some of the skills and dispositions, such as being **persistent**, **open-minded** and **courageous thinkers** and **communicators**. As **communicators**, we will have **time** and **opportunity** to share these goals with our parents during our Parent/Teacher/Student conversations in the coming days and engage in dialogue about how we might achieve them,

As **readers**, we are continuing to focus on the skill of **locating directly stated information** within a text. To develop this skill, we will read and view a range of **fiction** texts, such as narratives, novels, picture books and fairy tales, and use the visual organiser **Double Entry Journal** to identify and document the facts, key events and characters in the text, and our opinions, thoughts, feelings and wonderings. Some of us will focus on the strategy

of **inferring**, where we will use our prior knowledge and experiences, and clues within the text, to **make connections**, **build explanations**, and **make meaning**.

As **mathematicians** we are consolidating our number skills. As **thinkers**, we will continue to engage in number of the day tasks to solve quick mental math, where we will **make connections** to place value as we show our thinking strategies, and we are engaging in various math games to practise our counting and multiplication strategies. As **self-managers**, we will be **open-minded** and **persistent**, and **take risks** when we are challenged. As **researchers**, some of us will have **time** and **opportunity** to engage with our mathematics consultant Colleen later this week to explore number lines, money strategies, fractions and solving multi-digit addition and subtraction problems.

As people of a faith based community, we are tuning in to the whole school scripture, 'The Road to Emmaus', from Luke 24:13-35. As thinkers and researchers, we will have time and opportunity to engage in the thinking routine Word-Phrase-Sentence to activate our prior knowledge and generate ideas, first thinking and wonderings about the scripture. Through dialogue with others, we will identify a word, phrase and sentence that speaks to us to make connections and see new layers of meaning. We will justify our thinking using the thinking routine 'What makes you say that?'

Sustainability

Welcome back to all our **Sustainable learners**. During the past few weeks our learners have been engaged in remote learning at home. As a **learning community** we have engaged in identifying strategies to engage in learning independently. During this time, we **discovered** that we have a number of amazing chefs and gardeners amongst us. I would like to thank all our learners and parents who **engaged** in preparing amazing dinners, cakes and desserts. We have an extensive collection of recipes that we can add to the **Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden.** During remote learning time some children and their families established vegetable gardens. It was great to see how our gardeners were able to plant and maintain their vegetables.

As **Sustainable learners** we are all very excited to be back at school as we continue with busy and productive terms with lots of **learning opportunities** for our learners to be engaged in. This week our learners will revisit and discuss various aspects of their learning that have occurred throughout the term. They will be engaged in **documenting** and illustrating their **reflections**.

As the term continues we will be focusing on:

Vegetable Garden:

This includes establishing our vegetable garden. Looking at seasonal vegetables that can be planted. If parents/careers have any vegetable seedlings that can be donated to our school garden this would be most appreciated.

Worm farms.

This includes cleaning and setting up our worm farms. Purchasing materials that are needed for our worm farms.

Packaging:

Revisit packaging and continue focusing on a package free lunchbox.

Once again thank you to all our families who took the time and opportunity to engage in cooking and gardening with their children.

Digital Technology

As **thinkers** students in Foundation to Year 2 **Digital Technologies** are reflecting on their different **Digital Technologies experiences** throughout the first half of the year. We have **explored** how they used **technology** to access their **email safely** at home **online**. They are also **sharing** their **wonderings** about how different **technologies** work.

Year 3/4 students are **reflecting** on the **process** of sending an **email safely** each morning to their teacher while they were home **online**. They are **documenting** different things they **understand** more about **technology** after the first half of the year. We've discussed times that we have needed to be **persistent** while using technology.

As **thinkers** year 5/6 students have been using different **reflection stems** to document their experiences in Digital Technologies this year. They're using **Microsoft Word** and making use of **headers and footers** to create their document. They **document** times where they have been **persistent** with **technology** and **insert** a **picture** of their **learning**. This could be anything from **code** from a **Scratch game** they've made to a **photo** they've **photographed** that uses **elements** that they've **researched**.
