${\it To}$ All In Our Learning Community,

The papacy of Pope Francis has been marked by a desire to dialogue with all peoples of the world. Dialogue provides the opportunity to discover the views and thinking of others. Pope Francis' recent visit to Bahrain in November had a focus on opening up the dialogue and in particular interfaith dialogue.



The Pope's press office pronounced that the papal symbol for the visit represented 'the commitment of peoples and nations to encounter each other free from prejudice and in a spirit of openness as brothers and sisters'. Such dialogue has the potential to break down barriers and identify similarities rather than a focus on difference.

One of our focuses as a Catholic Dialogue school is that of hospitality. On the surface this means being welcoming to all. However, at a deeper level hospitality is an invitation to encounter 'the other'. Through being open to others we seek to gain new perspectives and understandings not only about 'the other' but ourselves. In terms of our hermeneutical learning we speak of 'seeing new layers of meaning', 'valuing a multiplicity of voices' and 'an openness to and from other religions, cultures and ways of life'.



Through our encounters with one another Pope Francis suggests we can encounter God. In a recent tweet about Advent the Pope said: 'Let us be shaken out of our torpor (mental inactivity) to recognise God's presence in daily situations. If we are unaware of His coming today, we will also be unprepared when He arrives at the end of time. Let us remain vigilant!'

The challenge for us as members of a Catholic Dialogue school is to take up the invitation to be hospitable and enter into an authentic dialogue in order to encounter others. Through such hospitality the mystery of God among us can be realised in our daily encounters not just at Christmas.

Advent, therefore, challenges us to see God's presence each day—How might this be realised for you this week through your offer of hospitality and the invitation to encounter an other?

School Fees and Levey Structure 2023

What's Happening in the Learning Spaces Foundation-Year 2 Learning Spaces

"One of the most common responses from groups is that in a culture of thinking, there is a sense of purpose to the learning" ~Ron Ritchhart.

As a Catholic Dialogue school, we are continuing to inquire into the Season of Advent. We are finding out about Mark's Gospel (Mark 1:1-8). We will engage in the thinking routine **Word- Phrase- Sentence** to capture what **we found meaningful in the text**. We will use the hermeneutical prompts, **seeing new layers of meaning** and **interpreting texts and symbols** as we engage with the scripture. Using simple commentaries and images, as **researchers** and **thinkers** we will consider the community of writer's Mark wrote for, as we dialogue with each other to **recontextualise** the gospel for today. There will be



opportunity to discover about the person of John the Baptist and his role in the scripture. We will reflect critically to **make connections** between the scripture and what it might tell us about Advent. Through continuous reflection on our dialogue about Advent, the gospel and the **provocations** around the school, we will consider what the meaning behind the Catholic story of preparing for the gift of Jesus at Christmas might have for ourselves, our beliefs and the world today using a **future orientated perspective** - *This text talks to me of a world in which...*

As **researchers**, we are continuing to find out about the understanding, "Our bodies grow and change over time but this process is different for everyone". We will closely **observe** the photos of ourselves from when we were a baby to now. We will take the time and opportunity to place our photos/drawings on a timeline. We **will identify and compare** how we have grown in our ability to use strategies to manage our emotions, look after ourselves and keep ourselves safe.

As **thinkers**, we are taking **time** and **opportunity** to **reflect** on our learning by sorting out all the information we have gathered. We will use a mind map to document what we have discovered about feelings, body signals, protective behaviours and how we grow and change over time. We will **identify** our own wonderings and ideas that we might be interested in to investigate further as part of our shared compelling question, *What are my feelings telling me? What should I do next?* As self-managers and researchers, we will be planning our own proposed question or idea as we enter into the **going further** phase of our inquiry. To **go further** invites us to plan and research our own personal inquiry that we can share with others.

As **mathematicians**, we are continuing to **consolidate** our **place value** understandings. Some of us will use **concrete materials** including bundling sticks, number lines to **find out** and **sort out** our **thinking** of place value. Some of us will practise **ordering numbers** according to **different criteria** for example, ordering from smallest to largest. We will use a range of manipulatives to help us demonstrate our thinking. We are focussing on the thinking routine, "What makes me say that is..." to help us develop the thinking moves **justify** and **reason with evidence** to help us explain our **mathematical thinking**.

As **readers**, we will continue to engage in reading a variety of texts. Some of us will use the **comprehension strategies** of **read and retell** and some of us will use the colourful semantics prompts to help us strengthen our **comprehension skills** and make meaning about what we read. We will **collaborate** by sharing our ideas in dialogue with each other to make connections, question and justify our thinking. We will continue to engage in reading and developing our reading behaviours through the PMe Collection.

Bridging Centre

Year 3/4 'School is a place to build strong relationships and for learning how our strengths can become gifts to enhance the lives of others' Kath Murdoch As a **Catholic dialogue school**, we will have **time** and **opportunity** to **consider** our first thinking as we **look closely** at a **text** '*I Like*, *I Don't Like*'. As **hermeneutical learners**, we will **interpret** the **text** after **listening** to it and **consider** what this has got us **thinking** now. Allowing our **thinking** to **change** and being **open** to **interpretation**, we will **reflect** on the **text** and **consider** in **light of the season of Advent** what our new thinking is. As we **open up our hermeneutical space**, we will **reflect critically** on the prompt '*expressing meaning in more than one way*'. As **communicators** and **contributors**, we will **respectfully share** our **interpretations** with each other and **consider** our **actions** as **families** and as a **community**.

To go further with our thinking, we will read an excerpt from the newsletter of Fr Brendan Reed. We will respectfully engage with the Catholic tradition and consider how our thinking is changing and our reinterpretations of this liturgical season of Advent is shifting. As we reflect on our thinking we will use the reflection stem *Advent is.* yet Advent is also...

As part of our **going further** phase of our **inquiry** into the question **'Health: What Influences my Decisions?'** we have had the **time** and **opportunity** to **formulate questions** to **find out** more about the area of **health** we have focused on. We have **collaborated**, together on a **data chart**, **summarizing** the information from each of our **health experts**, **identifying** what aspect of health they address and when and why a person might use their services. **Reflecting** on our **findings** as a group we are **considering** what questions we might still be **wondering** about that have yet to be answer through our learning **experiences**.

In our **mathematical** learning we have been **consolidating** our **understanding** of **measurement**. We have been revising the **concepts** of perimeter area and volume and its connection to two- and threedimensional shapes. We have been making **connections** between our **understanding** of **geometric** shapes, their **properties** and how to **measure** and **record** them **accurately**.

Leadership Centre Year 5/6 Leadership Centre - Celebration of Learning



As part of our Faith and Life inquiry compelling question, *How can we manage the challenges of change?*, as part of the Going Further phase of inquiry, we engaged in a personal mini inquiry. As researchers we explored something we were interested in finding out more about and had time and opportunity to analyse and reflect on our discoveries and changes in our thinking. We engaged in the thinking moves making connections, identifying new ideas and uncovering personal reactions.



Last Friday we engaged in a **Celebration of Learning** where we **shared our mini inquiries** with each other. **As reflective thinkers and communicators** we **demonstrated** a **deeper understanding** of what we inquired

into when we shared our personal inquiries with each other and articulated the skills and dispositions we strengthened throughout



our investigation. There was an array of ways our learning was documented including podcasts, flip books, digital presentations, diamond 9 strategy, brochures, books and infographic posters.









Our **celebrations** will continue this week with our time together at Wyncity Bowling Keon Park where we will engage in two games of Tenpin bowling and on our return to school enjoy our Pizza Lunch. Our Year 6 children will be presented with their Graduation Bear and have an opportunity to collect signatures.



We look forward to another Celebration of Learning when we share our

Portfolios Showing Growth Over Time with you. This is an opportunity for us to **celebrate the learning opportunities** we have **engaged** in throughout the year, our **reflections** on **what we have learned**, **how we learned**, **wonderings we explored**, **authentic learning experiences** we **engaged** in, **investigations we researched** and some of the **challenges and growth** we **experienced as learners** throughout the year.

Thank you for your support throughout the year. We wish our Year 6s all the best as they continue their journey of learning.

Japanese Learning

As learners and thinkers, students will have the time and opportunity to reflect both backwards and forwards in connection with our Japanese learning this year. We will use reflection stems to identify what we have already learned and what we would like to learn moving into the future.

Students in Foundation, Year One and Year Two, will consider the reflection questions *What did I learn in Japanese this year*?

What do I already know? What would I like to learn? What would I like to discover?

In connection with their future learning, students will also consider how the dispositions for language learning might be useful as they move into their next year of language learning, in particular Year 6 students as they move into secondary school. These include being: 'curious' – language learners are curious about what words mean and how they sound in the language they are learning; 'persistent' – practicing over and over to learn words, sentences, and correct pronunciation; and 'open-minded' - language learners are open minded about learning new ways of communicating and about understanding other cultures. They know that building relationships is about understanding each other.

Sustainability Learning

As **thinkers** all our **Foundation** – **Year 2** students had the opportunity to dialogue and share their thinking about the process of preparing and planting the strawberry seedlings in our strawberry towers. There were three steps needed to complete the task carefully. Students used a photo of themselves engaging in this, to help with their own documentation of their own part in this task.



As **collaborators** some of our **Year 3** – **Year 6** students continued to plant the remainder of our Albion Strawberry seedlings, some students engaged in weeding, watering and basic care around our veggie and herb plants and garden beds. Other students engaged in dialogue and documentation of a reflection piece, on their learning during Sustainability throughout semester two, while others collected all our compost bins from around the spaces to prepare and cut lots of appropriate food scraps for our worm farms over the Christmas holiday period.

This week in years **Foundation - 2** some of us will have the **time** and **opportunity** to complete a **reflection** on the different things we've learned in **Digital Technologies** this semester. We will think about the different things we've built with **Lego WeDo** and document our **favourite creations** and **how** they **work**. Those of us who have finished our **reflections** will have an **opportunity** to further **explore** the **indi**, **laptops** and **Lego**.

This week in year 3/4 we will be continuing to have the time and opportunity to complete a reflection about our experiences with Scratch and Excel. For our Scratch reflection we will be documenting using the reflection stems "I was a thinker when I..." and "It was challenging when...". For our Excel reflection we will use the reflection stems "I was a researcher when I..." and "I found it interesting when..." the rest of us will have an opportunity to independently explore how the indi robots work.

This week in year 5/6 we will be continuing to have the time and opportunity to complete a reflection about our experiences with Binary and Excel. For our Binary reflection we will be documenting using the reflection stems "I was a thinker when I…" and "It was challenging when…". For our Excel reflection we will use the reflection stems "I was a researcher when I…" and "I found it interesting when…" the rest of us will have an opportunity to independently explore how the indi robots work.

Physical Education

In Physical Education learning this week all students will be engaging in learning with a focus on the **fundamental movement skills** and the **teaching games for understanding**.

Foundation to Year 2 students will be practicing and revising their fundamental movement skills particularly the overarm throw with a major focus also on catching. Students will be activating their **prior knowledge** as we continue to **explore** sports that incorporate both throwing and catching.

Year 3/4 students will also be practicing their fundamental movement skills particularly the overarm throw and be applying these as they engage in play based learning activities. As **learners**, students will be practicing the correct sequence when performing this skill and will be learning to throw with accuracy as they engage in games which will require them to think tactically.

Year 5/6 students will learn about the sport of golf. Through their learning we will learn about the importance of our posture, our stance when hitting and our body's position when making impact with the ball. Students will also learn about the importance of taking a full swing of the golf club when striking the ball.

Performing Arts

Our musicians from Foundation–Year 2 will continue our inquiry of the musical notes. We will be practicing how to sing and perform the matching Curwen hand sign for the notes Do, Re and Mi. We will focus on the learning asset *collaborator*. We will consider what it means to be a *collaborator* as we practice our Christmas carols for the End of Year Mass.

Year 3/4 will be continuing to engage in our inquiry of the musical language solfege and the matching Curwen hand signs. We will focus on the learning assets *collaborator and self manager* we will consider what it means to be a *collaborator and a self manager* as we practice our Christmas carols for the End of Year Mass.

Our musicians in Year 5/6 will continue to engage in our inquiry of the ukulele. We will be exploring the different chords in the key of C major. We will need to use the learning assets *self-managers*, *contributors* and *collaborators* as we also engage in the practice our Christmas carols for the End of Year Mass.


Visual Arts
