Our 2023 Confirmation candidates will participate in a child parent workshop this coming Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> July at 7pm. The workshop will provide the time and opportunity for children and parents to dialogue with each other about their understanding of this sacrament today. The preparation and celebration of sacraments at Mother Teresa PS involves all learners who engage in a number of learning opportunities to reflect on and share their understanding of the sacraments in dialogue with the Catholic tradition, and in this instance, noting in particular the Roman Catholic tradition.

Why the Roman Catholic tradition? The Roman Catholic tradition celebrates Confirmation when children are about 12 years old. Therefore, our candidates for Confirmation are members of the Roman tradition. Within the Eastern Catholic and Orthodox traditions the sacrament of Confirmation occurs at the same time as baptism.

Our Catholic Dialogue School is made up of Catholic and Orthodox traditions further enhanced by the presence of non-Christian faith traditions. Such diversity of religious traditions is reflective of the broader Australian community and makes for rich dialogue. Through dialogue with others our own faith understandings can be enhanced, challenged and /or affirmed. Belgian Theologian, Lieven Boeve (2007, 2019) suggests that through dialogue with those of other religious traditions our own fixed positons on faith can be interrupted or challenged, enabling us to rediscover aspects of our faith and for his to be strengthened. Further, Boeve suggests that the Dialogue school is the best place for such interactions and encounters to be experienced promoting this practice for life. In a multifaith and culturally enriched Australia our Dialogue school not only promotes religious understandings but respect and acceptance of diversity.

As we dialogue about confirmation this term we are invited to be open to the thinking of others. How might understanding of Confirmation be discovered or rediscovered? How will others be encouraged to enter the dialogue? What does the Catholic tradition say about confirmation and how is your own thinking affirmed or challenged by this?

## Confirmation Preparations and Celebrations

Please note the details for our celebration of Confirmation this term.

- Confirmation Parent & Child workshop at Mother Teresa PS Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> July, 7pm
- Confirmation Sign Up and Presentation Weekend Weekend of 12th and 13th August, 2023
- Confirmation Celebration—Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2023 1pm at Kolbe Catholic College, Greenvale Lakes.

The celebration of confirmation this term is for Roman Catholic children who are baptized and have also received the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist. Eastern Catholic children including Chaldean, Syro-Malabar, Coptic, Maronite and Melkite rites have already received Confirmation or Chrismation at the time of their baptism and therefore do not receive the sacrament again. The richness of our Catholic community means that these children as well as children from other religious traditions can engage in dialogue sharing their own experience and/or understanding of Confirmation.

## What's Happening in the Learning Spaces

"Parents should be educated in the language of schooling, so that the home and school can share the expectations, and the child does not have to live in two worlds – with little understanding between the home and the school". John Hattie, 2009

### Foundation – Year 2 Learning Spaces

"The Inquirer is driven by the desire not to simply accumulate or conquer a body of knowledge but to make meaning of the ever-changing knowledge landscape if which we are part of." Kath Murdoch, 2015

As **thinkers**, we will use the thinking routine **Connect-Extend-Challenge** and identify our first thinking about a disposition e.g. resilience, using the thinking move **Connection Making** in small groups. We will read a variety of text, and use the thinking move **extending our thinking** and add the new ideas we have about the **disposition**. We will then identify our Challenges by adding our **questions** and our **wonderings**.

As **thinkers**, we will use the thinking routine **Step Inside** and the thinking move **perspective taking** to consider the thoughts, feelings and actions of the characters in the picture books. We will make our **thinking visible** using thought bubbles. As literacy learners we are developing the comprehension skill of **inference** to help us uncover new **layers of understanding and meaning** about **dispositions** for learning.

As **researchers**, we will begin to identify and document our **prior knowledge** about our compelling question "**How do we tell our stories**?". We will use the following questions to prompt and support children's voices. We will display our thinking in **words and pictures**.

- What is a story?
- What do we know about stories?
- How can we 'tell' stories?
- What do we know about the arts?
- How might the arts help us tell stories?

Using the thinking routine **See-Think-Wonder** we will view closely some of the work of the artist <u>Andy Goldsworthy</u> by viewing a short clip from YouTube. As **researchers** we will identify one key idea that we saw or heard from the video about how he creates his art using what he finds in nature. As artists we will explore our outside environment to notice nature around us and take time and opportunity to create our own art by thinking about the question - **What stories can we find in nature?** We will share our stories with each other through our art work.

We will have opportunities to connect to **writing** by using our art as seeds for shaping writing. We will identify our purpose and message by explaining what we want our reader to know about, think about or feel.

In Mathematics, we will focus on the thinking move, **reason with evidence** to support our thinking. As we solve simple addition and subtraction problems, we will consider how materials, ten frames and number lines can support our thinking. As thinkers, we will take the time to think back over our learning and reflect on ourselves as learners. We will use green and orange stickers to determine if we successfully understand the skills or if we need to keep practising. Some of the skills we are working towards are,

- Counting on
- Count back
- Build to ten
- Doubles
- Near doubles
- Bridge to ten

### **Bridging Centre**

## Year 3 – 4 Learning Spaces

The bridging centre has been reflecting on the learning to learn inquiry and identifying agreed ways around the school. This learning has provided a refreshment to the space and children are more aware of their expectations leading into the second half of the year. To tune in to this term inquiry 'How do arts connect communities?' children will be documenting their first thinking about what the arts are and what a community is, in a variety of ways such as writing, drawing and creating artworks. We have begun making connections to the understandings below to show our first thinking about this inquiry.

### **Understandings:**

- The arts can help give people a sense of belonging and identity within a community
  - Communities can document the **stories** and **events** of the **past** through the arts
    - Communities **express** their identity through a wide range of **art forms** 
      - The arts help **connect culture** and communities

If you or a family member are an artist of any form and would be willing to share your artform with some children, please contact your Learning Space Teacher.

As writers, we have been reflecting on all the experiences that we engaged in over the holidays, by identifying different seeds that we could use to help us think more creatively about our writing. Please continue to bring 'seeds' to school to help your child engage in purposeful writing.

This coming week we will be beginning to tune in to the concepts of Multiplication and Division. Children will be engaging in independent learning as well as focus groups about Multiplication and Division. Some learners will be focusing on different strategies to solve maths problems, whilst others are focusing on worded problems and identifying the problem they are being asked to solve. This is a great opportunity to practise the Goodies and Baddies with your children, even if they have finished learning them at school.
