T_o All In Our Learning Community,

Last Tuesday I was privileged to accompany a number of our year 5/6 children to the University of Melbourne where five of our Year 5/6 children presented at the Kids Conference. This conference is facilitated in various parts of the world and hosted in Melbourne by the Melbourne Graduate School of Education at the University of Melbourne. The presentation by the Mother Teresa Primary School children drew interest from a number of schools present who sought further information and requests to visit our school.

As educational leader I was particularly proud of the way in which these children prepared for the presentation and more specifically the reflective nature with which they identified the learning assets and disposition that were needed to engage in this learning process. They were very clear about the process required to get to the presentation stage and how they had grown as learners as a result. Through engaging with them a number of times over the past weeks I could see the growth and development of these learners. At our recent celebration of learning I know parents will have witnessed the way in which our children can confidently articulate and engage in various processes of learning.

Thursday and Friday of last week I participated in a consortium of educators throughout the country related to Catholic school identity. As a participant I was required to reflect on my own work and to share this with others collaboratively through a given process. I was asked to consider how my involvement in the consortium changed my thinking and my actions for this ongoing work. Through my reflections I was draw to thinking about the Year 5/6 learners and learners at Mother Teresa PS. Learners within our learning community are part of a unique learning environment. With the child at the centre they are empowered to share their thinking and reflect upon what it means to be a learner. Children are of course born inquirers curious about the world around them. As educators we hope to nurture this within our learning community and empower learners to continue to inquire through various forms of scaffolding. In the coming weeks children will continue to inquire and reflect on their learning documenting their achievements and considering future goals. These reflections will form part of the learner- self assessment and Faith and Life Inquiry journals which will come home at the end of the year. Please take time to celebrate these wonderful learning achievements.

Foundation – Year 2 Learning Spaces

As part of Faith and Life inquiry this week, we will be visiting CERES, an environmental education centre. To prepare for the excursion, we will **activate our prior knowledge** around how our actions impact the survival of living things. We will read the text '*A Story of a Wetlands Food Web*'. We will look at the visual glossary before reading to find out about what some of the key words might mean. We will **locate information** directly in the text identify how each living thing is connected to another. As **readers** and to sort out our thinking, some of us will consider what the author was trying to tell us about how **living things** can be **connected**.

As **researchers**, we will **tune in** by watching a video about CERES. We will **predict** what we might see and do while we are there. As part of **sorting out**, after the excursion, we will take the time to **reflect** on our shared experience and consider what we discovered in connection to the understanding; *We share places with living things – our actions can impact their survival (positively or negatively)*. We will use **Kath Murdoch's reflection tool 4 Steps** to identify what we did, what we learned, why we did it and consider what we might do next. We will also reflect on and think about how we displayed the disposition of **curious** while we were there.

As **thinkers**, we will **activate our prior knowledge** around the word **Advent** as tuning in to the season which is part of the **Catholic tradition**. We will use the sentence starter, '*Advent is..*' to come up with a statement that explains what we think Advent is about. As **thinkers**, we will engage in the thinking routine **Think Pair Share** and share our ideas with a partner.

We will engage in the thinking routine **See Think Wonder** to look closely at images and symbols connected to Advent. *This routine encourages students to make careful observations and thoughtful interpretations. It helps stimulate curiosity and sets the stage for inquiry.* We will identify **what we see, what it gets us thinking about** and identify any **wonderings** we might have.


As a **Catholic dialogue school**, we will have **time** and **opportunity** to **look closely** at a **text** *'I Like, I Don't Like'*. As **hermeneutical learners**, we will **interpret** the **text** after **listening** to it and **consider** what this has got us **thinking** now. **Allowing** our **thinking** to **change** and being **open** to **interpretation**, we will **reflect** on the **text** and **consider** in **light of the season of Advent** what our new thinking is. As we **open up our hermeneutical space**, we will **reflect critically** on the prompt *'expressing meaning in more than one way'*. As **communicators** and **consider** our **actions** as **families** and as a

community. We will **respectfully engage** with the **Catholic tradition** and **consider** how our **thinking** is **changing** and our **reinterpretations** of this **liturgical** season of **Advent** is shifting. As we **reflect** on our **thinking** we will use the reflection stem *Advent is.. yet Advent is also...*

To further our thinking, we will **look closely** at the provocation of the **Christmas tree** in the open learning space. We will consider an action this provocation is inviting us to engage in and think of how **we can show hospitality** to others. Our Mini Vinnies group are inviting donations of non- perishable food items including tinned food, biscuits, pasta and long life drinks. All donations will be given to the Craigieburn Chapter of St. Vincent de Paul.

Bridging Centre Year 3–4 Learning Spaces

"The season of Advent... restores this horizon of hope, a hope which does not disappoint for its founded-on God's Word." (Pope Francis)



As a **Catholic dialogue school**, we will have **time** and **opportunity** to **discover** our **hermeneutical space** through **interpreting text and symbols** and **seeing new layers of meaning**. While using the **key thinking moves - looking closely**, **describing**, and **observing details** we will **consider** what we see, **think** and **wonder** while **looking** at an **artwork**. Through **dialogue with others** and while being **inclusive** of all **voices** and **thinking**, we will **share** our **interpretations** about what the **image** has us **thinking** about. As a way to **go further**, we will **revisit** the **scripture** about the **Annunication in Luke's Gospel 1 26:38** and consider our **connections** between the text and the image.

As part of **finding out about human decisions** that **impact living things both negatively** and **positively**, we will have **time** and **opportunity** to **engage** in a **jigsaw opportunity**. This **learning** requires us to **engage** with different peers and move around to different spaces within the Bridging Centre to find out about how humans can make a positive difference to the lives of living organisms. As **thinkers**, we will **make our thinking visible** on a **data chart** to **show** our **thinking** and **discoveries** about how **particular habitats** were **interrupted**, what impact humans made and how we demonstrated the **disposition** of **resourcefulness**. As **contributors**, we will come back together within our own learning spaces and share our thinking with others.

Alongside this mini-inquiry into human impacts on the environment, we are beginning to consider our **reflections** around this **Faith and Life Inquiry 'How do living things grow and change?'** Through **writing opportunities** and **conferencing**, we have practiced **documenting factual texts** about a living thing. While looking at **different exemplars** and **focusing** on how to **structure** our writing, we also continue to **find ways** to **show** others our **understanding** of different living things through mind maps and through the use of digital technology.

As **mathematicians**, we are continuing to **engage** in **problems** involving **money** and **financial purchases**. For some, we are learning how to use an **open number line** and the **applying** the **counting up strategy** to **solve** the **change** given from an **amount**. *For example:*

If I buy milk for \$3.50 - how much change will I receive from \$5.00?\$3.50 + 50c = \$4.00\$4.00 + \$1.00 = \$5.00. As thinkers, we are also beginning to engage in mathematical problems involving chance and probability. We are conducting chance experiments, identifying, and describing possible outcomes and or everyday events and order of chances of occurring.

Year 5–6 Learning Spaces

Inquiry is a life-long preparedness to change our minds, to listen to those whose ways of seeing, thinking and feeling are very different to our own and to remain curious, open-minded and open-hearted as we encounter even the most challenging perspectives. Kath Murdoch

As part of our Faith and Life inquiry, as critical thinkers, we are exploring an artwork, as part of tuning in to the season of Advent. We will engage in the thinking moves describing, interpreting and perspective taking to document our current interpretation and understanding through the thinking routine Zoom In. This will enable us to observe closely and identify, as we zoom in on a part of the artwork, what we see or notice and what this makes us think about. As more of the artwork is revealed we will document what we now see and notice and how our thinking has changed from our initial interpretation. As the final part of the artwork is revealed we will have time and **opportunity** to consider what we think the person in the image might be **feeling**, **thinking** or concerned with and why they might feel that way, and we will be invited to make connections between what we are seeing or noticing and the season of Advent. As reflective thinkers we will consider what this text means for us today and engage in the thinking moves making connections and **uncovering personal reactions**. We will **document our thinking** using the sentence starter - **This** *text speaks to me of a world in which* As we will be **reflecting critically**, **engaging in the mystery** of God and a continuous process of dialoguing with others we are learning in a hermeneutical way. As collaborators and communicators we will listen respectfully and actively to others and engage in the thinking routine What makes me say that?, as this supports us to share our current interpretations and encourages us to understand multiple perspectives.

As writers and readers as part of our Faith and Life inquiry understanding, How can design help living things adapt?,' as curious researchers we will be gathering relevant information and ideas about a wondering we are interested in inquiring into and exploring as part of our sorting out phase of inquiry. During our mini personal inquiry, as researchers we will have an opportunity to use visual text (photos, diagrams, videos) to gather information. Some of us may read information texts, view digital texts on Behind the News, and/or some of us may view short educational film clips. As thinkers we will be interpreting and analysing the information we gather and documenting our new ideas and the changes in our thinking on a Lotus Diagram.

As mathematical thinkers we are taking the time and opportunity to consolidate our understanding about various mathematical topics we have engaged in throughout this semester. We will engage in the thinking moves activating prior knowledge, making connections and wondering as we explore word problems from our mathematical resource - Think Tanks. Some of us are engaging in word problems related to Number and Algebra and some of us are engaging in word problems related to Measurement and Geometry. As inquirers, as part of finding out and sorting out our thinking we will engage in the thinking routine Claim Support Question. This routine helps us to develop thoughtful interpretations by encouraging us to reason with evidence and explore strategies to justify our responses.
