Change from XUNO to Compass!

A few weeks ago I wrote about my frustrations with the XUNO platform and my hope that the company would be able to fulfill their promise that all families and staff would be able access and use the online platform. Unfortunately this has not happened as we still have families unable to log on and staff unable to complete simple tasks such as marking the roll.

Therefore I have made the decision to change to a more user friendly platform and one in which many schools use. This platform is called Compass Education: School Management System. On Monday Conchita, Lina Heath and myself had our first training session. We were blown away at the ease of this platform. The feature that I love the most is that google translate is embedded in the program so that families are able to select a language to read the messages in.



We have not rolled over yet and therefore **Xuno will still be the platform that we use until Tuesday 11th March**. We will be running sessions on downloading the app and how to use it. These sessions will be run by Heath Leighton, our digital technologies teacher, with an interpreter available to translate for families who require this support.

Message from the Acting Deputy Principal

Very shortly, the students in Year 3 and Year 5 will begin the NATIONAL Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). It will be held between Wednesday 12th March to Monday 24th March. NAPLAN tests assess student knowledge and skills in Writing, Reading, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. During the two weeks of testing, test catch up sessions - where possible - will be made available for students who were absent on the testing day.

Learning and Teaching News

This week, our F-2 teachers began implementing a new reading structure based on a body of knowledge called The Science of Reading. This research incorporates evidence from disciplines that include developmental psychology, educational psychology, cognitive science and cognitive neuroscience and provides great insight into the way children learn to read.

The MACS vision for reading instruction is for every student to commence school with access to a high quality, evidence-based literacy program made up of the following core areas known as the 5 pillars of reading:

- Phonemic Awareness
- Phonics
- Fluency
- Vocabulary
- Comprehension

Over the coming months, our F-2 teachers will begin exploring these 5 pillars of reading in more detail. I look forward to sharing this learning with you all.
