School Closure day

Last Tuesday on the School closure day, our staff undertook the Team Teach training which was presented by MACS staff. Team Teach is an accredited professional development program built on proactive behaviour support, with a strong emphasis on relationship-building, de-escalation, and minimising risk and restraint.

Its aim is to equip school staff with:

- A comprehensive set of positive behaviour support and de-escalation strategies
- A toolkit of both non-restrictive and restrictive physical interventions
- Structured post-incident restorative approaches and support

This training was very positive and all staff walked away from the day with a clear understanding of managing challenging behaviours, clear procedures for responding to incidents, and how to create a cohesive environment that supports both staff and students. The next step for us as a school is to begin the implementation of Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Message from the Acting Deputy Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

We've made some exciting changes starting this term to the way we teach Mathematics at Mother Teresa, to support deeper understanding and greater success for every student from Prep to Year 6. Our lessons now follow a consistent whole-class structure that includes several key elements:

- **Review:** Each lesson begins with a warm-up that revisits previously taught strategies and concepts. This helps students consolidate their learning and build confidence.
- Explicit Teaching: The teacher then introduces a new mathematical focus, clearly explaining and demonstrating the learning focus for that session, checking for student understanding along the way.
- Practice Time: Students have time to practise the new skill or strategy independently or in small groups.

 Targeted Support and Extension: During the practice time, the teacher is able to adjust the learning by offering additional support or extending tasks to meet individual student needs. The teacher is also able to work with groups of students or individual students to provide further guidance, support and / or extension as required.
- Lesson Wrap-Up: At the end of the lesson, the teacher revisits the key learning and checks again for understanding, ensuring students leave with a clear grasp of the day's focus.

This structured, consistent approach helps us to create a very explicit method towards the teaching of Mathematics. In addition, it also supports the development of a positive and supportive learning environment for all students. This approach is based on years of research around how children learn and evidence based high impact strategies, particularly in Mathematics, to support the way that they learn.

To implement this approach at Mother Teresa, our staff have been engaging in professional learning around the Science of Learning, as well as taking part in facilitated planning sessions. We look forward to seeing the positive impact that all of this will have upon the teaching and learning of Mathematics across the school.

Learning and Teaching News

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are excited to share some important updates about our teaching and learning approach in Reading in Years 3–6. As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering high-quality education, we are implementing a new, evidence-based model of explicit teaching using resources developed by Ochre Education in partnership with Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS).

This shift reflects current educational research and best practices to enhance student learning, particularly in literacy. The Ochre resources offer a structured and consistent approach across classrooms and are designed to support both teachers and students in reaching their full potential.



The approach includes several key components designed to support literacy development in a clear, sequenced and engaging way:

- **Daily Review** A short, focused session at the start of each lesson that revisits key concepts and skills to strengthen memory and understanding.
- Clear Scope and Sequence in Spelling & Grammar A carefully planned progression of learning in spelling and grammar that ensures students build their knowledge step-by-step in a logical and connected way. The explicit teaching of spelling occurs daily.

Novel Studies with Teacher Read-Alouds – Students engage with high-quality literature that builds vocabulary, comprehension and critical thinking. Teachers model fluent reading through regular read-alouds, helping students hear expressive reading and better understand text structure, tone and meaning.

Handwriting and Typing - Regular, explicit instruction and practice to build fluency, legibility and confidence in writing by hand and practice in typing on a device.

Paired Fluency – Structured reading practice with a partner to build oral reading fluency, expression and confidence.



What This Means for Your Child

This approach may look and feel a little different from what students (and teachers) are used to. As with any new learning, there will be a period of adjustment as everyone becomes familiar with the structure, pace, and routines. However, we are confident that, over time, this method will significantly benefit student outcomes.

Supporting Teachers and Students

All teaching staff are engaging in professional learning and collaboration to implement the new approach effectively. Classrooms may include more whole class direct instruction, modelling and guided practice before students work independently. This ensures clarity, reduces confusion and promotes mastery of key skills. During independent practice time, the teacher is able to work with groups of students or individual students to provide further guidance, support and/or extension as required.

Your encouragement and understanding during this transition is greatly appreciated. You can support your child by:

- Reading together at home and discussing the stories they're exploring
- Encouraging a positive attitude toward trying new things and being persistent



John 21:1-19


A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish..

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night. It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?' He answered, 'Yes Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Feed my lambs.' A second time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He replied, 'Yes, Lord, you know I love you.' Jesus said to him, 'Look after my sheep.' Then he said to him a third time, 'Simon son of



John, do you love me?' Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' and said, 'Lord, you know everything; you know I love you.'

Jesus said to him,

'Feed my sheep.
'I tell you most solemnly,
when you were young
you put on your own belt
and walked where you liked;
but when you grow old
you will stretch out your hands,

and somebody else will put a belt round you and take you where you would rather not go.'

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, 'Follow me.'
