Message from the Acting Deputy Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

On your child's school report this year you will notice a change as to how Mathematics will be reported. Previously, there were separate results for the strands of Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, Statistics and Probability as seen below.

However, with the implementation of the revised Victorian Mathematics curriculum at Mother Teresa, teachers will now report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a single, aggregated score as shown below. Also, for the June 2025 reports only, there will be no indication of progress since the last report (as shown in the example above), due to the change in reporting requirements and the altered standards for each level, within the revised curriculum.

This change to the reporting of Mathematics will occur across all Catholic schools in Melbourne, as they all implement the revised Mathematics curriculum. At Mother Teresa, what we will continue to provide on the report will be an indication as to the progress your child has made in each of the specific areas of Mathematics covered for that semester. The areas covered in Mathematics curriculum v.2.0 across the year are:

Statistics	Probability (commencing at Year 3)

Learning and Teaching News

Dear Parents and Carers,

At our Staff Meetings last week we continued to explore information that has come out of research into the Science of Learning. We reviewed why children seem to learn some things effortlessly — like talking, playing games, or copying adult behaviours — but need more help when it comes to reading, writing, or doing maths. That's not a coincidence! Research in the **Science of Learning** explains this difference by separating knowledge into two types:

🧬 Biologically Primary Knowledge

These are the skills most children naturally develop just by being part of the world around them. They include things like:

- Speaking and understanding their first language
- Recognising emotions and social cues
- Moving, playing, and interacting with others

Children are wired to pick these up without needing formal teaching. They learn them through play, observation, and daily life.

Biologically Secondary Knowledge

These are skills that are important for life in today's world — like:

- Reading and writing
- Doing maths
- Learning science or history facts

These don't come naturally. The brain has to **work harder** to learn them. Children need **structured teaching**, **guided practice**, and **lots of support** to make progress in these areas.

🧠 Why This Matters in School

At school, most of what children are expected to learn — especially as they get older — falls into the "secondary knowledge" category. That means learning can:

- Feel challenging or tiring at times
- Require repetition and review
- Take longer for some children than others

This is **completely normal**. Learning secondary knowledge is like building a skill — it happens step by step, with help and encouragement.

🏡 How You Can Help at Home

You don't need to be a teacher to make a big difference! Here are some simple ways to support your child's learning:

- Talk about learning as effortful but worthwhile it's okay if it feels tricky at first
- Encourage them to explain things to you it helps them remember
- Read regularly on their own or with you
- Celebrate progress and recognise that mistakes are an important part of everyone's learning.

Gospel Focus – Eternal life

In the gospel passage, Jesus says of the sheep that belong to him, 'I give them eternal life.' He does not say, I give them the promise of eternal life. The message that comes through the gospel of John is clear that eternal life is not some future existence, but rather a new way of being in the here and now. But that is not to suggest that there is not an 'eternal' quality to eternal life. The gospel of John makes clear that eternal life begins in the here and now but has no end.
